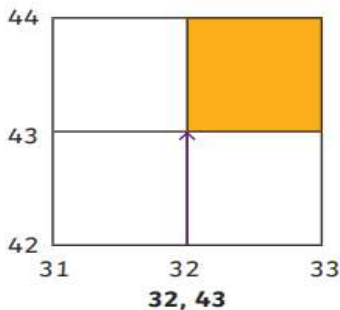
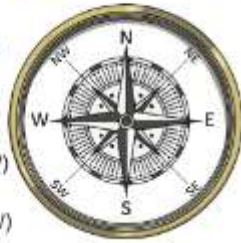

| Grid References | The easting and northing numbers are put together to create a four digit grid reference, e.g. (32,43), which refers to the bottom left corner of a square on the map. |
| Ordnance Survey map | Detailed maps of Great Britain where each square represents 1km squared (1km ²). |
| compass | A tool used for showing direction. |
| coastal | Something on the shore or seaside. |
| tourists | People who travel to a different place other than their home. |
| Counties/ Counties | Areas that countries or states are divided into. A small area containing lots of towns and villages. |
| symbol | Small pictures, letters or lines that represent a feature. |
| landscapes | An area of land and everything you can see on it. |
| Tsunami | A tsunami is a giant wave caused by a huge earthquake under the ocean. |
| tectonic plates | The earth's crust is made up of large areas called tectonic plates that join together. |
| Mantle | Extremely hot rock that flows. 3000km thick. |
| magma | Extremely hot, liquid rock. |

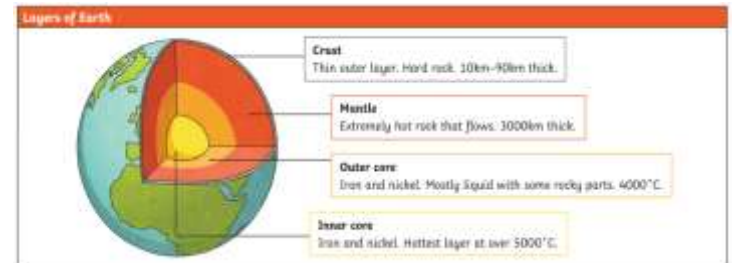
