

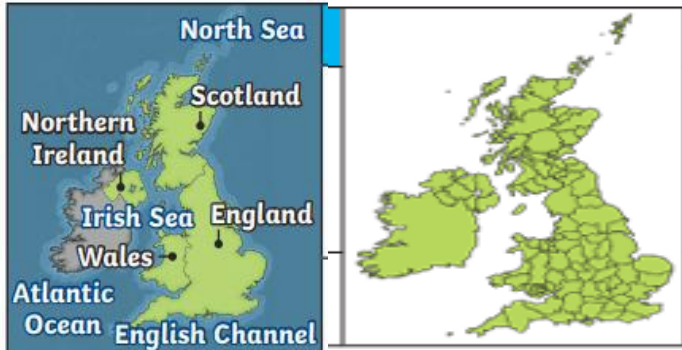
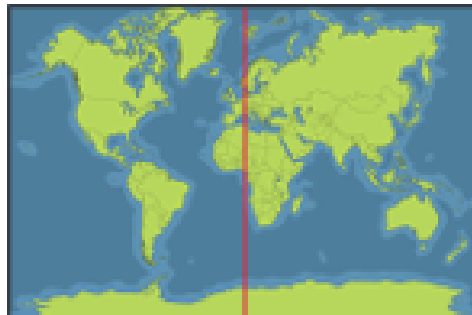


Cycle B Spring Term Year 3 /4 Geography Knowledge Organiser.

Key Vocabulary

UK	England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
country	An area of land with its own government, rules and borders.
capital city	An important city, often where the government works.
landmarks	A feature of a landscape or place that is easily recognised. It could be something made by people (a human feature) or something that occurred naturally (a physical feature). Big Ben is a landmark in London.
physical feature	A feature that has been formed by nature.
human feature	A feature that has been made or changed by humans.
Great Britain	England, Scotland and Wales.
prime meridian	An imaginary line which divides the Earth into the eastern and western hemispheres.
continent	A very large area of land made up of lots of countries including islands.
